- •Positive Alternatives provide fun, challenging, and structured activities with supervision, so people have constructive and healthy ways to enjoy free time and learn skills. These alcohol and drug-free activities are provided with the intent to help people stay away from situations that encourage the use of alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs.
- •Alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs (ATOD) Presentations are conducted as standalone, age-appropriate activities that increase knowledge or create awareness of the state's four prevention priorities.
- •Community-Based Education and Mobilization Activities strengthen resources to prevent substance use and misuse in the community. Such activities include participation in community health fairs, parent-teacher nights, school board meetings, and other related community-based activities.
