# A.W.A.R.E. Student Services

2024-2025

School personnel at AWARE campuses utilized referral pathways to identify students in need of Tier 2 or Tier 3 mental health interventions. After a referral to an AWARE provider, most students received school-based, individual or group counseling services targeting their mental or behavioral health needs.

During the 2024-2025 school year, 322 students received services through AWARE.


